



Impact of ECE Teacher Education on Program Quality, Child Outcomes or Teachers: A Partial List of Research Evidence

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This document provides a few citations that have shown the relationships between teacher's education and better classrooms, child outcomes and teacher benefit. The first two of these are meta-analyses. A meta-analysis researches the literature, finds various studies done on the relationship between education and better classrooms and/or child outcomes, uses and combines the original data from these studies, creates a much larger and robust database and conducts a larger analysis. You will note in those citations below that the number of different studies used is provided.
